Next deadlines concerning the implementation of the END

- ➤ <u>30 June 2007</u>: 1st round of mandatory strategic noise maps have to be drawn up
- ➤ <u>18 July 2008</u>: 1st round of mandatory action plans have to be drawn up
- ➤ <u>30 December 2007</u>: MS have to report their maps related data to the EC
- ➤ <u>18 January 2009</u>: MS have to report their plans related data to the EC





Legal requirements laid down in the END concerning the 1st round of strategic noise mapping

- Competent bodies for strategic noise mapping can use interim methods set in annex II + related EC recommendation adopted in 2003
- they can also use national methods IF these are equivalent to the interim methods
- Equivalence MUST in this case be demonstrated by MS
- $\triangleright L_{den}$ and L_{night} based maps must be drawn up in any case





Key elements of the WG AEN Good Practice Guide

- ➤ GPG version 2 published in 2006 has been elaborated by WG AEN, an expert group set by DG ENV in agreement with MS
- \triangleright it provides practical and technical assistance to strategic noise mapping authorities concerning the 1^{st} round of mapping
- it is not legally binding paper, however it is very useful
- it can be download from the EC EUROPA noise webpage
- ➤ people can send e-mails into a mailbox indicated in this webpage, WG AEN will reply and post the reply to the GPG dedicated website



Legal harmonisation process: Important messages

- the END states that the EC has to submit proposals on harmonised assessment methods to the adoption by a regulatory noise committee composed of MS representatives
- \triangleright the END does not set a deadline for this, however it is anticipated that the harmonisation process could intervene before the 2^{nd} round of noise mapping (=before 2012), not before the 1^{st} round
- ► IMAGINE methods will obviously be duly considered and scrutinized by EC services in this perspective, particularly because 50% of IMAGINE project is funded by EC
- >other valuable methods, if any, could be also considered
- ➤ once the regulatory committee has not formally approved the EC proposal on harmonised methods, the interim or national equivalent methods should be applied



European Commission's desires

- ➤ How can the IMAGINE deliverables effectively assist EC services in drafting its proposal concerning common noise assessment methods
- ➤ What we still miss after the completion of IMAGINE project to ensure drafting, programming and implementation of common noise assessment methods?
- ➤ What is the feedback of the stakeholders concerning the IMAGINE deliverables?
